Letter from the Diocesan Bishop

Our 2018 FaithWorks Campaign has just wrapped up and I am delighted to say that we exceeded our goal of \$1,350,000. On behalf of the ministry partners we fund and their clients and volunteers, I want to thank you and your parishioners for helping us to meet our diocesan objective in 2018.

The success of the 2018 campaign is due to the generosity of an anonymous donor and the response of Anglicans in the parishes. Under the terms of a \$75,000 challenge grant to the campaign last year, every new or increased donation from the parishes would be matched, dollar for dollar, up to \$75,000. Anglicans responded, increasing their donations by \$108,000 and helping us to exceed our overall fundraising goal by over \$15,000.

It is worth noting that, with the increase in parish giving, FaithWorks continues to have a ripple effect within parishes and in the Episcopal Areas. Parishes are encouraged to retain up to 15% of undesignated FaithWorks contributions to support parish outreach ministry. In 2018, parishes withheld \$65,572, nearly 8% higher than in the previous year.

Moving forward, the 2019 FaithWorks campaign will seek another donor who is willing to provide momentum to the campaign by offering a challenge grant. This will ensure that FaithWorks can continue to provide much-needed support for our Ministry Partners for years to come.

Please thank members of your congregation for their continued support of FaithWorks. God has blessed us abundantly and in gratitude we reach out and help those in need in our community and beyond.
