BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Black Heritage Service will be online

The Diocese's annual Black Heritage Service will be held on Zoom on Feb. 28 at 4:30 p.m. The service, which is in its 26th year, is usually held at St. Paul, Bloor Street but will be held online this year due to COVID-19 restrictions. The theme, "God's People: Grounded in Faith, Filled with Hope, Called to Action," reflects the context of the Anglican Church's response to the issue of anti-Black racism and bias. A new feature of the celebration will be a moderated dialogue between Bishop Andrew Asbil and two young members of Black Anglicans of Canada, Aleshia Johnson and Brittany Hudson. The service, sponsored by Black Anglicans of Canada, will be available on [Zoom](#) and streamed live on [YouTube](#).

As it is Black History Month, it is time to learn about some of the black people who have been a part of building our country. Here is an article submitted by Doug Heyes.

Lucie and Thornton Blackburn:

Lucie and Thornton Blackburn, like many of the Underground Railroad refugees, headed for the towns and cities where they could find work and where they would help mould the character of their new homes.

The Blackburns were fugitives from Kentucky who escaped slavery and settled in Detroit. However, their former owner tracked them down there and tried to return them to slavery. In a highly publicized escape that left Detroit engulfed in riots, the Blackburns were able to make it to Canada. The Canadian Courts defended them against the threat of extradition. This was seen nationally and internationally as a symbol of Upper Canada's role as a safe haven for Black refugees.

The Blackburns settled in Toronto and, in 1834, built their home on what are now the grounds of the old Sackville Street School. Thornton operated the first cab in the young city of Toronto. The Blackburns worked tirelessly in their new community for the abolition of slavery and to help other Underground Railroad refugees settle in Canada.

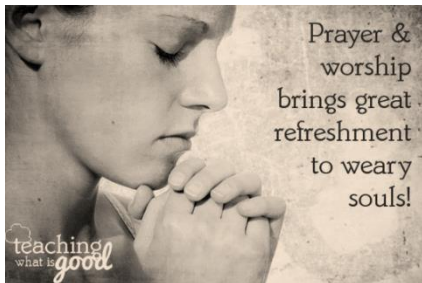
In 1985, archaeologists in downtown Toronto discovered what would become the most highly publicized dig in Canadian history: the remains of a house belonging to the Blackburns.

Karolyn Smardz Frost spent years researching this era of the Underground Railroad. Her book, *I've Got a Home in Glory Land: A Lost Tale of the Underground Railroad*, which recounts the saga of Lucie and Thornton Blackburn, from slavery in Kentucky to freedom in Ontario, won the Governor General's Literary Award for non-fiction in 2007.

COLDEST NIGHT OF THE YEAR VIRTUAL WALKATHON



Mosaic Interfaith Out of the Cold (www.miotc.ca) reached out about their Coldest Night of the Year Virtual walkathon being held on February 20th 2021. Some of the sites have set up teams and are raising funds, so they reached out to see if our site can do the same; either by being a participant or sponsoring others among the congregation.

This year it is a **virtual walkathon** which means you register and raise funds online, and then walk anytime in February, anywhere you want. You might want to think of setting a specific goal, such as to walk 5 or 10 kilometers since this is not a specific planned 'walk'. The amounts can be accumulated over time (i.e. 1 - 2 kilometers each time) so long as they are tracked and logged. Then on February 20th, they are having an online celebration!

You can hear the sermon by calling the church phone number and choosing option 8.

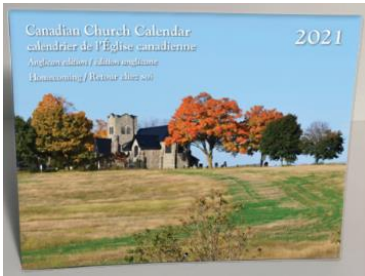

It's a lovely way to connect with others which is so important in these challenging times. We hope to see some new people. Who's going to join us for the first time?

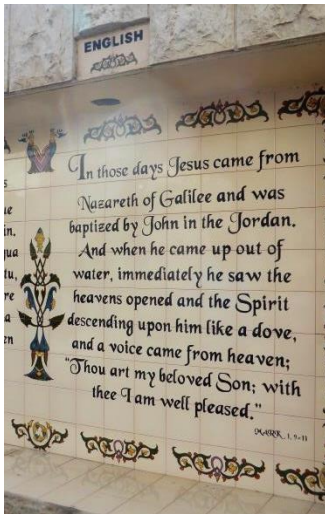
Information on how to join in will be in the update on Feb. 12th.
