

Birthdays and Anniversaries

Birthdays and anniversaries are important because they recognize thresholds in life for not only individuals but also communities. So now in 2021, St. George on Yonge stands at the threshold of 100 continuous years as an Anglican parish community. The future is as close as tomorrow, yet an anniversary finds its foundation in the past and the memories contained therein.

The hymn *Our God, Our Help in Ages Past* contains in verse 5 the words "Time like an ever-rolling stream bears all our years away; they fly forgotten, as a dream dies at the opening day." The phrase referring to years flying forgotten away may seem a bit harsh but I can relate to it somewhat since I am now in my early 70's. So, I am grateful that in 1982 St. George's produced a booklet titled *Yesterday Today & Tomorrow – the first 60 years and beyond.* Memories prior to the current parish generation were laid down in that booklet from which I have provided the section titled *St George's -Yesterday.* (See attached documents) For historical clarification reference is made in that section to Duplex Road. Duplex Road was renamed Canterbury Place and until the 1990's the address of the church was 77 Canterbury Place.

PEOPLE IN TORONTO – COVID VACCINE

Individuals can now book a vaccine appointment online at the provincial website - https://covid-

<u>19.ontario.ca/book-vaccine/</u>. Currently this is for people 55 and older and some other eligible groups. Check the website for more information, a list of the eligible groups and to make an appointment. Please note that the eligibility is frequently changing so check the website for more current information.

Individuals ages 18 to 49 in hot spot communities are eligible for vaccination, starting in Peel and Toronto. Upcoming mobile and pop-up clinics will be promoted locally by community partners and public health units. Do not book through the provincial booking system.

Now people **40** and older can make an appointment at a pharmacy. Go to https://covid-19.ontario.ca/vaccine-locations and put in your postal code to find the pharmacies that have the vaccine available in your area. Another person can do it on someone else's behalf if they have their full name, date of birth, and postal code.
