NATIONAL INDIGENOUS DAY OF PRAYER

This Sunday, June 20, is National Indigenous Day of Prayer. We hope that you will join us for worship and listen to a special reflection by the Rt. Rev. Chris Harper, Bishop of Saskatoon.

In light of the recent focus on the role of churches in the residential school system, we are reminded that the Anglican Church of Canada has started the process of reconciliation, including an apology by the Primate in 1993. (See attached document – Apology to Native People 1993)

The language is outdated, but we recognize that this is an historical document using the language that was considered acceptable 28 years ago.

WILLOWDALE CHURCH COALITION

NEXT MONDAY, JUNE 21 at noon, there will be a missional discussion with the **Willowdale Church Coalition** including a discussion led by Reverend Andrea Budgey and Reverend Matthew Sams about a collective response to the 215 bodies of indigenous children found in Kamloops. A DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVE

While we have been dealing with the pandemic, there seems to have been opportunity for a great deal of self-reflection. Many tragic events have taken place, or been revealed, which has brought social justice issues to the forefront. People have become aware of the idea of privilege and many issues which show that so many people do not have privilege or respect that all people deserve. We have been exposed to perspectives of various groups of people and challenged to learn more about how some have been treated in the past and today.

I have challenged myself to learn more about the experiences of Indigenous people in Canada and am taking a free online course from the University of Alberta. We need to learn the truth, before true reconciliation can happen. I have become aware that Canada Day, which I have always celebrated enthusiastically, is not looked upon the same way by Indigenous people. In fact, the Confederation of Canada was a starting point for many of the problems that are still being dealt with today. Please see the attached article for an Indigenous perspective on Canada Day. This year it will be a day of reflection for me, instead of celebration. If you're interested in the course, it's called Indigenous Canada.

Every minute, 20 individuals are forced to leave their lives behind to escape war, terror and persecution. On **Sunday, June 20th**, AURA invites you to commemorate the strength and courage of refugees around the world. We will be joined by **Hassan Al Kontar**, also known as the "Man @ the Airport". After being deported from UAE to Malaysia in 2017, Hassan refused to return to Syria and face military service. He ended up stuck inside the Kuala Lumpur Airport.

Hassan was able to share his story with the world through social media, and finally received refuge in Canada. He is now a permanent resident, an advocate for refugees, and author of his first published book. Hassan will be reading a passage from his book and holding an interactive Q&A with the audience.

Here's how it works:






Stained glass window, St. Vitus Cathedral, Prague
