LIVE FLOWERS FOR SERVICES

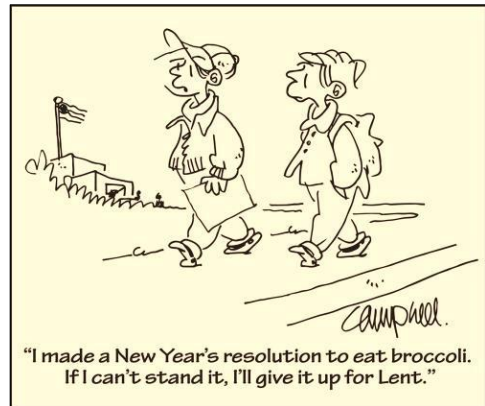
