We are victims of our success - our weekly attendance has grown to over 40 people a week. We urgently need help to continue. Currently we have 2 levels of classes, a beginner class and one for people already comfortable with some English. We need people to teach the sessions as well as others to support the teachers. Someone to greet the people as they arrive and direct them to the correct class, prepare the coffee/tea, copy resources for the teachers, clean up afterwards, generally supporting the teachers. Are you able to help us out? Or have a friend who may be interested? No teaching or ESL experience required - we just need friendly people who are eager to get to know other people and want to help them settle and become comfortable in Toronto! Please note that volunteers for ESL must take an online Sexual Misconduct Policy training that takes about an hour before starting to volunteer (it can be done at home or at the church).

NeighbourLink North York and Street Eats Market present the 1st Taste of North York Food & Drink Festival, September 8-10 at Mel Lastman Square!


