**The Rev. Canon John Wilton** died on November 12, 2024. Ordained deacon in 1987 and priest in 1988, he served as Assistant Curate of St. James Cathedral, Incumbent of St. Joseph of Nazareth, Bramalea and St. George on Yonge, Regional Dean, Canon Pastor, Priest-in-Charge of St. Augustine of Canterbury, and Interim Priest-in-Charge of St. George on-the-Hill. After retiring in 2014, he served as Interim Priest-in-Charge of St. George-the-Martyr, Parkdale, Christ Church, Bolton, St. Matthew the Apostle, Oriole, St. Cyprian, and Honorary Assistant of St. Matthew the Apostle, Oriole.
