BLACK HISTORY MONTH AT ST. GEORGE ON YONGE: COURSE & STUDY GROUP

The University of Alberta is offering the course *Black Canadians: History, Presence, and Anti-Racist Futures* online at no cost. It's intended to help us learn about some of the major histories, migrations, artists, and activists that have contributed to the presence of Black people in Canada.

We invite you to sign up for the course, complete the four modules on your own time, and then join us for a zoom study group on Tuesday nights @ 7pm - 8pm (Jan 28, Feb 4, Feb 11, Feb 18) to discuss what we've learned, and to pray using materials from contemporary Black theologians. Each week of the study group will cover one of the modules of the course, but please feel free to join us regardless of how much of the material you have covered. You also do not need to attend all four sessions - come when you can. All are welcome!

Prayer shawls are created to remind people that they are held in God's loving care and in our prayers; they are given at times of celebration, transition, or difficulty. Prayer shawls come in many shapes and sizes: shawls, scarves, lap rugs, stoles, baby blankets. "Pocket prayer shawls" (a few inches square), are for people to keep nearby as reminders of God's love and our friendship.
