St. George on Yonge will be holding two wonderful concerts as part of the parish's 100th anniversary celebration:

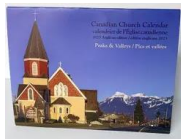
- Saturday, Nov 5, 7:30 p.m. – Philip Chiu, a rising star among Canadian musicians, will present a piano recital
