REMINDER: GUIDELINES TO PREVENT ANAPHYLACTIC REACTIONS

St. George on Yonge is a **nut-sensitive** and **seafood-sensitive** facility. There are children in the day care who have <u>Anaphylactic Allergies</u> to peanuts and tree nuts. There are members of the congregation who have <u>Anaphylactic Allergies</u> to peanuts and tree nuts, fish and seafood. Contact with food containing the above ingredients can be <u>Life Threatening</u>.

Food products containing peanuts or tree nuts are not allowed throughout the building at all times.

For parish and outside events: If fish or seafood are planned to be served, the Hospitality Coordinator or Parish Administrator need to be informed ahead of time. These foods need to be kept separate from all other food and should be labelled. The parish will endeavour to limit the amount of seafood/fish brought for events.

Your co-operation is extremely important in this matter.

We are very grateful for those who have already come forward with additional funds; these gifts are really appreciated but everyone's continuing support is needed. Even if you cannot afford to give large donations, even your small contribution can help, when combined with everyone else. Even a small sacrifice of 2 to 3 fewer coffees each week for each giver can add up, with a larger tax benefit at the end of the year for each of you. Even if a small additional donation is the most you can spare, like this example, you can still help in solving our ongoing cash flow issues. Without increased financial support, St. George cannot exist here much longer.


