CHURCH LIBRARY





KEEP THE LIGHTS ON' CAMPAIGN MESSAGE

Over the past few months you have all seen the weekly reminders from the leadership that St. George on Yonge needs your financial support. Members should be proud of their response so far and it is making a difference. As of the end of October, internal support at the parish has increased by almost 40,000 over last year, or about 25 %. Total income for the parish, aside from the normal fees paid each month by users, has risen almost 65,000 over the same period in 2022, and currently sits at approx. 30,000 more than the approved total budget for 2023 at last February's annual Vestry meeting.

Year to date expenses continue to be monitored and held in check by the leadership as we continue to control, wherever possible, costs. Total expenses as of the end of October are approx. 45,000 lower than those encountered over the same period in 2022 and are almost exactly on par with budgeted levels expected at Vestry. For a number of years now we have seen a cash flow shortfall of 5-6,000 per month here at St Georges, and as an example for November 2023 the closing balance on our bank account was only approx. 500 lower than that held on the 1st. We are proud to be able to say that these results to our KEEP THE LIGHTS ON campaign are the results of the hard work, dedication, and generosity of all of you. THANK YOU!!!

All donations received, no matter if from a member of our parish family or not, in any amount, as long as the donor provides details such as name and address for our Envelope Secretary to record, qualify for an income tax receipt that helps to reduce your income tax for the 2023 tax year.
