### Vestry Meeting

The Vestry meeting for St. George on Yonge is after the service this Sunday, February 9<sup>th</sup> in the sanctuary (and on Zoom). We will have a short social time in the Narthex after the service before the meeting will begin. Please note no food or beverages except for water are allowed in the sanctuary. For those Vestry members joining us on Zoom, please connect by 11:00 a.m.

If you qualify as a voting member, please check the Vestry List on the bulletin board in the Narthex to make sure you're on it.

Each member of Vestry attending will be required to sign our Vestry book with the following declaration (for those connecting on Zoom will have to verbally agree):

"I solemnly declare that I have been a member of the Anglican Church of Canada and of this congregation for at least three (3) months, that I have attended regularly scheduled services of worship with this congregation at least three (3) times in the past year, that I am of the full age of sixteen (16) years and that I have not voted as a member of any other vestry during the previous three (3) months, nor do I intend to vote in any other vestry during the ensuing year."

Please note that a person must be baptized and have accepted the authority of the Anglican Church in order to be a member.

## **Black history month at St. George on Yonge: course & study group**

The University of Alberta is offering the course *Black Canadians: History, Presence, and Anti-Racist Futures* online at no cost. It's intended to help us learn about some of the major histories, migrations, artists, and activists that have contributed to the presence of Black people in Canada.

We invite you to sign up for the course, complete the four modules on your own time, and then join us for a zoom study group on Tuesday nights @ 7pm - 8pm (Feb 11 and Feb 18) to discuss what we've learned, and to pray using materials from contemporary Black theologians. Each week of the study group will cover one of the modules of the course, but please feel free to join us regardless of how much of the material you have covered. You also do not need to attend all four sessions - come when you can. All are welcome!

## **Season Of Renewal: Mark Your Calendars**

Bishop Andrew Asbil is encouraging Anglicans to attend one – or more – of the five large worship gatherings planned around the diocese in 2025. “It’s an opportunity for our community to come together and pray and sing and rejoice as followers of Jesus Christ,” he says.

The gatherings will be held in each region of the diocese so that people can easily get to them. The services will be held on March 22 at 2 p.m. at St. James Cathedral, on March 29 at 2 p.m. at Trinity, Streetsville, on May 31 at 2 p.m. at All Saints, Whitby, on Sept. 27 at 2 p.m. at St. James, Orillia and on Oct. 25 at 2 p.m. at St. Paul, Bloor Street.

## **Palm Crosses**
