Season Of Renewal: Mark Your Calendars

Bishop Andrew Asbil is encouraging Anglicans to attend one – or more – of the five large worship gatherings planned around the diocese in 2025. "It's an opportunity for our community to come together and pray and sing and rejoice as followers of Jesus Christ," he says.

The gatherings will be held in each region of the diocese so that people can easily get to them. The services will be held on May 31 at 2 p.m. at All Saints, Whitby, on Sept. 27 at 2 p.m. at St. James, Orillia and on Oct. 25 at 2 p.m. at St. Paul, Bloor Street.

We hope everyone from St. George will be able to attend the gathering on October 25, as it is reasonably close to us.

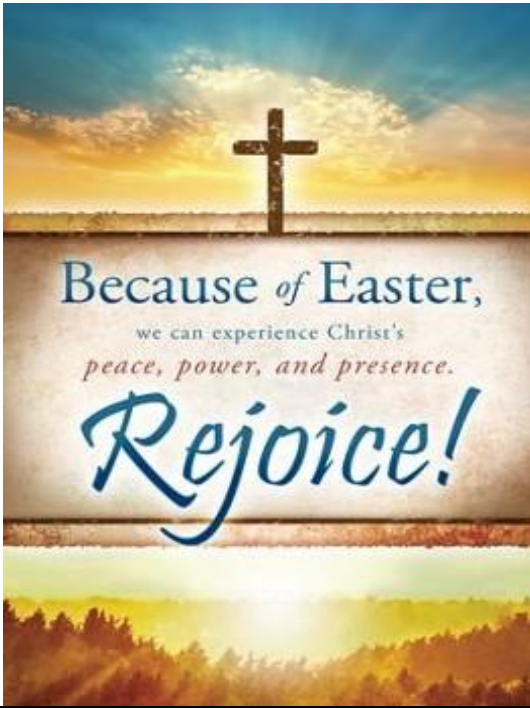
